

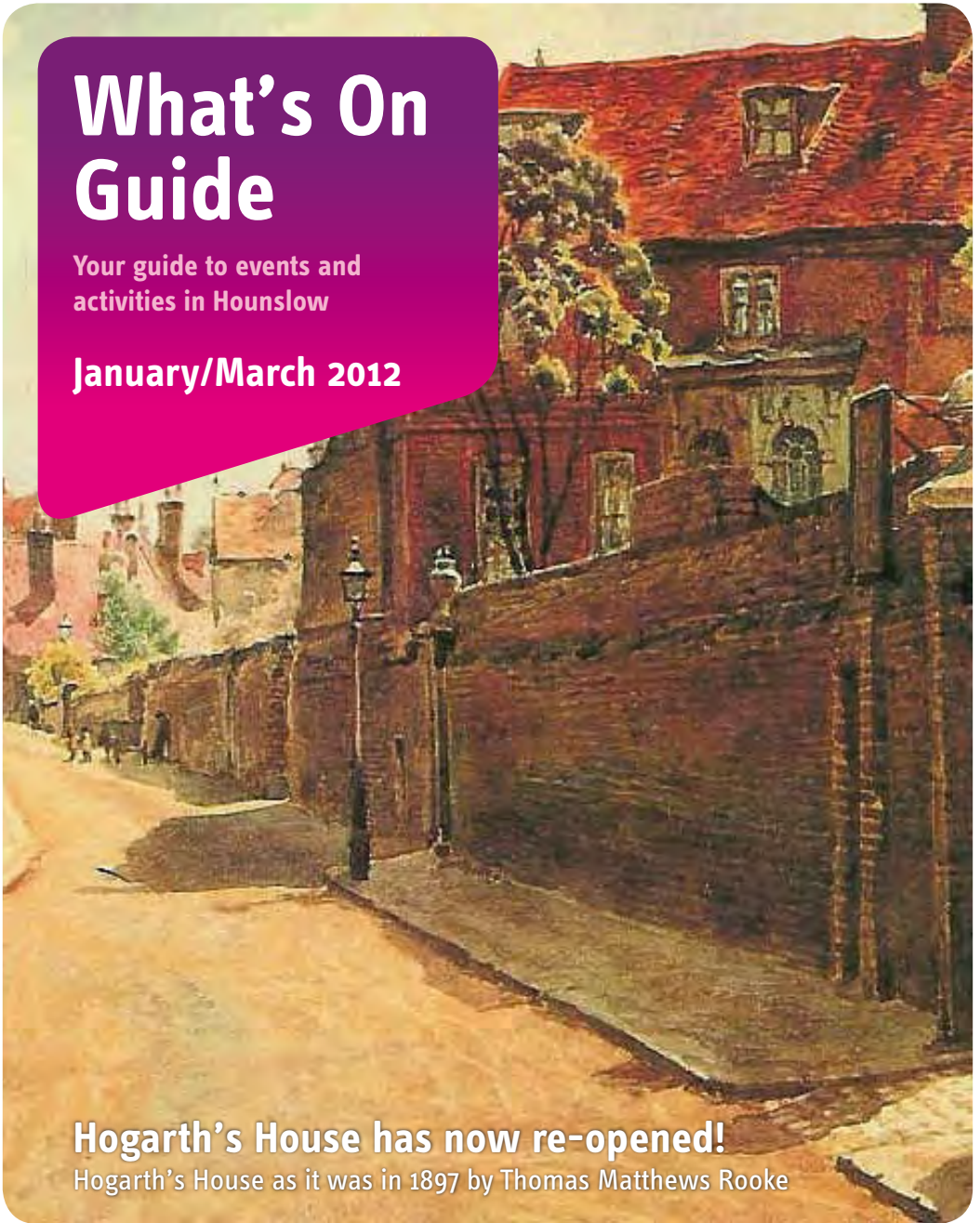

We're gearing up for the arrival in our city of the world's biggest sporting event, the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

To help Hounslow residents get warmed up for the big occasion, we've got a range of sporting exhibitions across many of the leisure facilities in our borough.

Gunnersbury Park Museum has a celebration for 2012 of local sporting clubs and heroes. One of a series of Our Sporting Life exhibitions taking place across the country, this retrospective provides a unique insight into how sport has shaped the country, its communities and people.

Many sporting stars have started their careers in the local area, including tennis champions Fred Perry and Dorothea Chambers, cricketer Mike Brearley, Olympic athlete Sylvia Cheeseman and one of the founders of the London Marathon, John Disley. Not forgetting of course Hounslow's very own Mo Farah, who recently won the 5,000 metres gold medal at the World Athletics Championships and will be hoping to repeat the feat at London 2012.

To coincide with this exhibition we're also offering a day of free sports-related action. Join in with the multi-sports activities provided by Brentford FC's Community Sports Trust in the park, and a chance for kids to create their own sports medal to take home.

Elsewhere, Boston Manor House is set to reopen and we're giving residents a special sneak preview in February. Join us to reminisce about past lives and events in the newly restored beautiful Grade I listed Jacobean manor house, with tour guides filling you in every step of the way about its special place in history.



We're also getting ready for the bicentenary of Charles Dickens' birthday with a mini exhibition on Dickens' links with the London Borough of Hounslow. Oh, and not forgetting World Book Day across our 11 libraries when we'll be announcing the three best entries of favourite reads, as well as National Libraries Day on the 4th February.

There's so much to see and do across our leisure centres in 2012 - I hope everyone in the borough gets to enjoy what's on offer and take part in what promises to be a landmark year for London.

Gunnersbury Park Museum is shared between Hounslow and Ealing and it opened its doors in the 1920s when the Park was acquired. It is the local history museum for the 500,000+ people who live in the London Boroughs of Ealing and Hounslow. The museum is housed in the former historic Rothschild home located in Gunnersbury Park, 180 acres of parkland, open space, sports grounds, wildlife areas and historic and formal grounds.

Boston Manor House

One of west London's lesser known gems, this is a fine Jacobean manor house built in 1623. Set back from Boston Manor Road in Brentford, the three storey building is situated in parkland containing a lake and ancient trees.

Chiswick House is a magnificent neo-Palladian villa set in beautiful historic gardens. Built by the third Earl of Burlington in 1729 to showcase his art collection and to enthrall his guests, the house continues to display many spectacular works of art. The gardens have benefited from a £12 million restoration project, completed in 2010. Look out for the Camellia festival from 18th February to 18th March 2012

City Read London – Dickens 2012



Dickens 2012 is an international celebration of the life and work of Charles Dickens which will take place to mark the bicentenary of his birth.

Londoners will read, discuss and debate *Oliver Twist* by Charles Dickens.

Other related events:

- Introduction by Local Studies librarian, James Marshall on Dickens and his links with the Borough of Hounslow followed by a book discussion on your 'Best of Dickens' – a general chat on your favourite Dickens novel. Drop in for 6.30pm on 3rd April at Chiswick Library
- A 'Victorian Music Hall' event in Paul Robeson Theatre on 10th April - It's been a while since Dickens 'came' to the Borough (Bill Sikes dragged *Oliver Twist* through Chiswick and Brentford to the Coach and Horses pub, on the way to do a burglary: Chapter 21, 1838).
- 'Play in a Day' by Feltham Arts in Feltham town centre
- The Victorian child, an event in Gunnersbury Park Museum on Sunday 1st April – looking at the lives of working class Victorian children, such as street sellers, chimney sweeps and pickpockets, with children having lots of opportunities to dress up in period costume and role play, including as some of the characters from 'Oliver Twist'
- Lots of reading group events discussing books by Charles Dickens.

Big Dance will take place across the UK from 7th to 15th July 2012 including a show-stopping event in Lampton Park on Saturday 7th July.

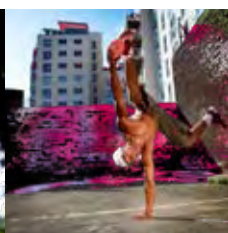

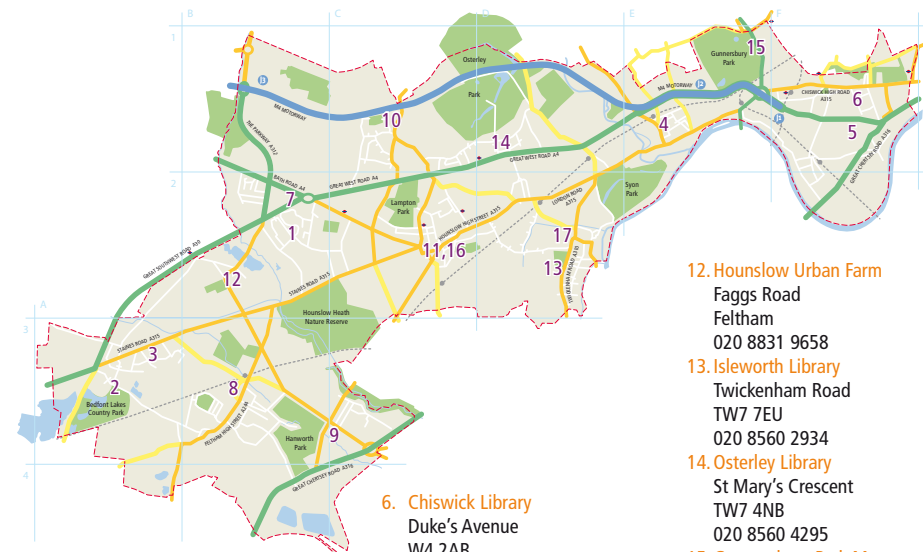
